
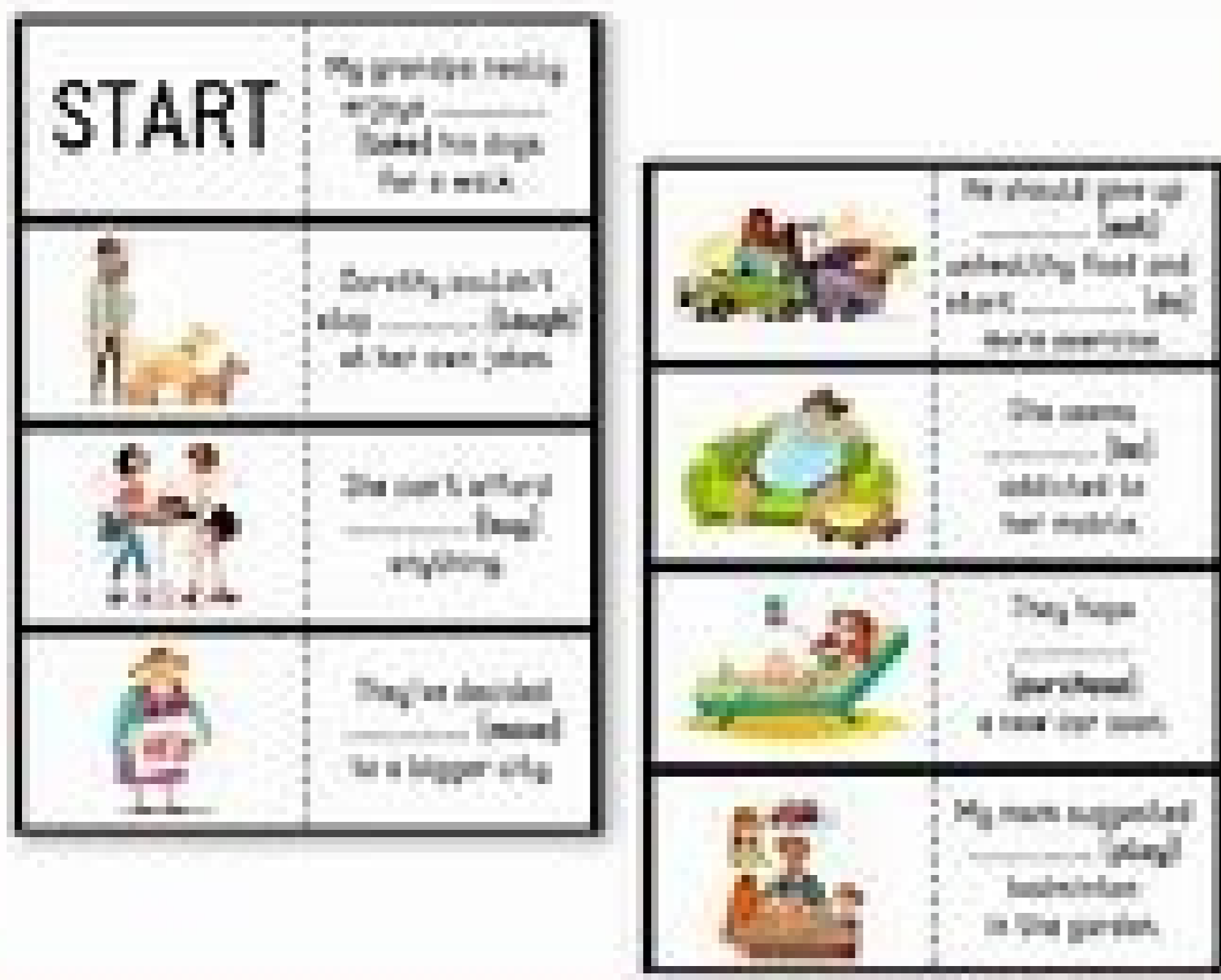

VERB PATTERNS (1)

When we put two verbs together, the first one often determines the form of the second one. Use the chart below.

The words in italics have different meanings according to the form of the verb than when they are in the PT column. They verbs in **bold** have had patterns with an infinitive or gerund. The words in **grey** have objects. The words in **red** are particles. The **grey** words are verbs or before the verbs.

can, must	bare infinitive	You can go now.
make, let	object + bare infinitive	Let me go .
hope, manage	infinitive with to	I hope to see you again soon.
remind, teach	object + infinitive with to	Did you remind Jim to buy some milk?
avoid, finish	-ing form	We should avoid going through London.
imagine, stop	object + -ing form	I can't imagine Jim being a doctor.
say, think	that clause	They said that they'd be here at six.
persuade, tell	object + that clause	They told us that they'd be here at six.
warn, predict	wh- clause	Nobody can predict what will happen.
ask, show	object + wh- clause	Can you show me the way to school?
agree, decide	preposition	We've already agreed on a plan. Have you decided about the evening?
challenge, congratulate	object + preposition	He challenged me to a game of chess. She congratulated us on our success.
